This is the Wright Museum’s annual invitation to schools to visit us during our winter season. We are closed to the general public in the winter, however schools can make an appointment during February, March, and April to visit us. It is a great time to visit because you usually have the entire Museum to yourself. You can request a docent-led tour of the Museum, or you can be your own guide.

This winter, in addition to our great permanent collection, we are proud to offer school students a special exhibit in our Art Gallery. It is an exhibition called “Memories of World War II: Photographs from the Associated Press Archives.” This exhibit includes some of the most iconic black and white photographs taken during the war.

Among the photos are: the German Army marching into Paris under the Champs-Elysees; Londoners in the underground train stations; Hitler at Berchtesgaden; the bombing of Pearl Harbor; FDR, Churchill and Stalin at their Tehran conference; the D-Day invasion; the raising of the flag at Iwo Jima; the liberation of German concentration camps; the surrender of the Japanese on the USS Missouri; the sailor kissing a nurse in Times Square; and much, much more.
